Scholarship 2012

This year, The Fallbrook Quilt Guild will award a \$500 scholarship to a graduating senior of the Fallbrook and Temecula school districts who will pursue an interest in fiber arts while enrolled in an accredited college, university or vocational school the fall of 2012. All students who are interested in the pursuing fiber arts as a career interest or hobby are encouraged to apply. The scholarship is also open to college students who are children or grandchildren of current members.

Qualifications include financial need, one teacher/counselor recommendation, an unofficial transcript and short essay form answers written for each of the following three questions:

- 1. Quilting has a rich past; pick a decade from the 19th or early 20th century and write about quilting in that decade.***
- 2. Quilts are usually made of blocks with interesting names. Using reference material from the library, personal collection or online, research block names, find one that describes you and tell why.***
- 3. Where do you see yourself 10 years from now?***
