GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Meeting date July 9, 2015

C*all to order:* A General Membership Meeting of the Fallbrook Quilt Guild was held on July 9, 2015 at the Fallbrook Community Center in Fallbrook CA.The meeting convened at 6:30 p.m. in the North Room. Presiding was President, Shirley Fleming, who led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Business/Committee Reports

President (Shirley Fleming): A brief explanation regarding the use of the North Room was given. The Community Center's Preschool Class needed the auditorium for graduation ceremony and to accommodate 200+ guests. Guild members thanked for their cooperation in making the most of the smaller space. Members reminded of the new agenda format providing access to refreshments prior to and during the business meeting. Also explained was the agenda change of the guest speaker immediately following the business/committee report portion of the meeting, in order to assure sufficient time allowance for the speaker's program. The break will be followed by Show & Tell and the various drawings. In addition, Board members were reminded of the Board meeting at the Quilter's Cottage on Friday, July 10 at 11:00 a.m. All members are invited to attend. The guild's annual audit will be conducted at the end of the Board meeting. Those conducting the audit will be: President Shirley Fleming, Past-Treasurer 2014-2015 Linda Musillami, Current Treasurer2015-2016 Barbara Vajda, and general members Marie Sundsboe and Andrina Lilly.

Treasurer's Report (Barbara Vajda): Reconciliation of the guild's checking account is current and balanced as of 6/30/2015.

Membership Report (Ardis Duhachek): Members in attendance = 61; guests = 2. Quilt Show 2015 Boutique (Linda Flynn & Lou Cobb): Gave boutique update and showed various recently donated boutique items including Christmas tree skirt made by Dixie Johns of recycled linens featuring cabbage roses. Ardis Duhachek donated dozens of key ring holders made of quilting fabrics as well as providing a display stand for the key ring holders.

Quilt Show Auction (Betsy Shirkey): Needs more donations of quilts to be auctioned. Anyone wanting to designate a minimum price should indicate this with a note attached to the back of their quilt(s) along with their name and phone number.

Quilts of Love (Connie Follstad): Thanked all who brought completed quilts. There are plenty of additional kits available for completion. Connie presented thank you gifts to those members who have been extremely productive.




HOSPITALITY REPORT


It's time to get your entries in! The September meeting is the deadline. If your entry isn't in by the September meeting, it will not be in the show.
