



Executive Board Minutes — November 15, 2019

Sylvia Williams called the meeting to order.

Attending were Sylvia Williams, Dixie Johns, Karen Johnston, Ann Turley, Mara Woods, and Jo Anne Russell.

A discussion about the recent quilt show started our meeting.

Sylvia Williams gave a treasurer's report, since Barbra Vajda was unable to attend. All of the figures have not come in so this was just a preliminary report for the quilt show. A deposit was made of \$17,409 after the show concluded. Exact figures will come after the bills are paid and each committee completes their record keeping.

Sylvia Williams reported that 402 opportunity tickets were sold for a total of \$367. This total does not add into the quilt show funds.

Ann Turley listed the programs she has lined up for 2020-2021 year. She almost has the schedule completed. She has a variety of teachers and classes for the new calendar.

Dixie Johns will send out a reminder about the quilt challenge for the December meeting. She also informed us of her plans for the January meeting. Don't forget to keep saving your fabric pieces for the Quilts of Love project.

Dianne Parker was unable to attend, but is still working to have our guild in compliance for our raffle permit

The meeting concluded with a brief discussion about our December potluck.

Meeting was adjourned.
