Fabric:

Bring your scraps! Lots of scraps. Make sure that some are as long as 18". A series of fat quarters can work here too. It's always better to have more fabric to pick from, so err on the side of bringing more than less!

Rotary Cutter

Items discussed:

Previous Minutes: November 14, 2014 Executive Board and December 4, 2014 General Membership meeting minutes were reviewed. Motion made by Sylvia Williams to approve minutes, seconded by Christy Smith. Motion passed. Minutes approved.

Treasurer's Report: Signed check for Community Center rental, need treasurer's report for next newsletter.

Refer back to President for further direction and possible committee formation for Design and Construct or proposals specific for the library project.

Food Pantry: Request for assistance from the Fallbrook Food Pantry to provide reusable fabric grocery bags may not be necessary due to one-use bag ban bill implementation delay.

Library (Ardis Duhachek): Has received quite a few overdue books back. All are now inventoried. Inactive surplus may be sold at a meeting, the Country Store during the Quilt Show or donated as appropriate if not checked out in over 3 years. Announcement of any sale would be made in the newsletter.

Ist Vice President/Programs: Feb 2015 Aleesa Carlton Modern Quilting, March 2015 Linda Pollums Hinged Quilts (modern quilt as you go), April 2015 -No workshop-speaker Karen Brow Java Quilts and the science behind exceptional quilts, May 2015- Cindy Meyers Paper piecing 2 quilting choices, quilt or runner.

Ways and Means: Our guild has sufficient white glove volunteers to show our opportunity quilt at Road to California on January 22nd. The mini quilt is in the process of construction. The Design and Construct team is underway with the 2015-2016 Opportunity Quilt.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH FOR FEBRUARY

Valentine Friendship Chain (not quite a 9" block)

From WHITE (or white on white, or off white or white with little bits of red)

(3) 3 3/8" squares cutting each diagonally twice in an X for a total of 12 large triangles.

(Handle these carefully as now there are two bias edges and you don't want them to stretch out!)

- (2) 2" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for a total of 4 small triangles.
- (1) 2 x 5" rectangle
- (2) 2 x 2" squares

From RED print

- (2) 2 x 5" rectangles
- (6) 2 x 3 1/2" rectangles
- (2) 2 x 2" squares

Lay out the red and white pieces to match the above picture.

Sew together the pieces in each row – EXCEPT for the SMALL triangles.

(HINT: When sewing a rectangle to a triangle in the rows, align the 'straight' edges and let the "point" hang over. When you sew the small triangles on the corners (the LAST step) mark the center of the long edge and match to the center of the square – then the "points" will be equal on either side.)

Press seam allowances toward RED.

Join rows. Nip dog ears as you go and press toward the center of the block.

Add WHITE SMALL triangles last – one to each corner of the block.
