Executive Board Meeting Minutes

Call to Order: An Executive Board meeting of the FQG was held at the Quilter's Cottage in Fallbrook, CA on 15 Dec. 2017. The meeting was convened at 10:00 a.m. by presiding President Barbara Vajda. Members present were Sylvia Williams, Betsy Shirkey, Tina Rainey, and Jan Conklin.

President's Aannouncements (Barbara Vajda): Discussion of feasibility for a pot-luck at January's meeting. Since there is a speaker, it was decided not to hold one. Everyone is welcome to bring holiday goodies if they'd like to share Christmas. Reminded Board that newsletter articles are due to Diane Trappen the 15th, so please submit as soon as you can after out meeting today. President will check with Community Center regarding possibility of funds return or use of funds for another month due to the Lilac Fire and cancellation of our December Potluck.

Treasurer's Report (Betsy Shirkey): We currently have a \$35,855.27 bank balance. A check from Abbey Party Rentals was returned to the Guild in the amount of \$18.70. Since there was no meeting in December, the \$200 check for entertainment will be voided. This means an additional \$218.70 will be added to the above balance.

Membership Report (Tina Rainey): We currently have 83 members. There was discussion as to what the Guild could do to increase our membership. It was mentioned that in previous years there was a flyer or handout that stated what the Guild does, about our meetings, etc., We can brainstorm this so we can come up with something exciting to create and give out to the Fallbrook Community to entice an interest in our Guild and possibly becoming a member. We would then present copies to the various Quilt Shops in the surrounding area to advertise our Guild to get the word out. Thinking outside the box – this is a work in progress. Anyone interested in brainstorming with the Board is greatly welcomed to help us out.

We also discussed the possibility of "Adopt a Quilter". This entails a current member "adopting" a new member to assist her by taking her under your wing and helping with how to make quilts (piecing, layering, etc.), answer a myriad of questions this new quilter has, etc. It's very possible that some of our newest members would like to have someone to go to for answers or help with something they are working on but don't want to seem clueless. **Barbara Vajda**—I was there myself when I first started in the Guild. I was very fortunate for the new friends who helped me out going from a sewer to being a quilter. I had a ton of questions.

Ways & Means (Sylvia Williams): Grace Errea is scheduled to speak on Thursday, 4 January. The topic is "The Value of VALUE". So far I only have 3 people signed up to take her workshop. As there wasn't a meeting in December, we couldn't get more people to sign up. If there aren't 10 attendees, we usually cancel the workshop. I will speak to her this week about the possibility of not doing the workshop.

Miscellaneous topics discussed:

There was discussion about increasing the guest fee at Guild meetings that have scheduled speakers. We've seen an increase in attendance for specific speakers and would like to increase the guest fees to accommodate the increased costs of providing these speakers for our members. Betsy Shirkey made a motion that the guest fee be increased to \$10 when there are speakers at our meeting. Jan Conklin seconded the motion. Motion passed by all in attendance. Guest fees will now be \$10 when there is a speaker starting on 1 January 2018.

Executive Board Meeting Minutes-continued

There was discussion about the cost of the Community Center and for our meetings in relation to the lower number of members. Do we need to use the big room with so few coming to the meetings or could we do with a smaller venue to stretch our funds further? Barbara Vajda will contact the Community Center to see what the cost of the smaller room will be compared to the room we currently use. We used the smaller room a few years ago when the School held their graduation in July. It may have been a little cramped for that meeting, but we have fewer members attending our meetings now. It might be a more viable use to us now. Sylvia Williams will check with FPUD to see if their conference room is a viable possibility, what it will cost, how many people it accommodates, etc.

There was discussion about our Facebook pages and who the administrators were. Some use these pages while others have not. It was mentioned that we start using it for posting pictures of our show and tell, announce our speakers/workshops and post pictures of our workshops on Facebook. Sylvia Williams will contact Lou Cobb and Sandy Scott regarding the ins/outs of what it all entails, such as how you get to the Facebook site, how you can post to it, etc.

Meeting adjourned at 11:50 a.m.
