

MESSAGES FROM THE 1ST VP

March Meeting

For our March meeting we have the pleasure of hosting Jean Impey, a nationally and internationally well-known quilter, artist, long-armor and curator of the Hoffman Challenge. She is a lifelong creative soul who finds boundless inspiration in diverse mediums such as painting, sewing, photography, ceramics, and more. Jean will present a program called “An Insider’s Look into the Textile Industry” after having been asked many times for information and insight into the Hoffman Family and their beautiful fabrics. She works closely with the company as a tour guide of their US facility, and as Curator of the 30+ year old Hoffman Challenge. Jean also designs quilts and kits. She will come with a Hoffman trunk show and samples of their new lines.

NEW CHALLENGE – IT’S A TOSS-UP!

A new challenge is underway and there is still time for you to join in. Please see me at the March meeting, your last chance to participate. Here’s how it works: Toss the dice to know what your block, your dominant color and your theme will be. If you can’t come to the March meeting, let me know and I will toss the dice for you.

The rules:

1. Your project can be no larger than 60” on any side.
2. You are free to create any sewn project as long as it includes your block, color and theme.
3. You may make your block in a traditional way, or you can distort it, make it wonky, or cut and reassemble it. It can be any size and shape you desire.
4. Your color must be dominant in your quilt.
5. You can interpret your theme however you see fit. For example, **Celebrate** could be the birth of a child, a birthday or anniversary, a beautiful spring morning. **Wild Things** could be polar bears, crickets or goldfish. **Bloom** – many things bloom – cactus, algae, roses, yeast, daisies. It’s totally up to you.
6. Project must be completed and shown at the June 2024 meeting.
7. Yes, there will be prizes awarded!


Fun Times are Coming

Quilt Show Final Accounting

The accounting for the quilt show has been completed and we had a very successful show.

Net income by area: Admissions – \$3,919.31. Auction – \$13,929.61, Country Store – \$7,488.30. These amounts represent the net income minus sales tax collected (which we need to pay to the state) and credit card fees. Final net income after deducting all other expenses was \$15,656.49.

Congratulations to all the people who helped and those who managed the committees! It is because of all your hard work that we were so successful.

Guild Insurance Concerns

The Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (SCCQG) is the organization that allows member guilds to purchase liability insurance at a significantly reduced rate. They are currently trying to fill several board positions for the next fiscal year, which runs from October 1 through September 30. If these positions are not filled, the Council will cease to exist and guilds will have to find their own liability insurance. If that happens, it is possible that our insurance cost could increase from under \$500 to over \$2000.00 per year.

The newsletter email includes an attachment with the roles to be filled along with insurance information. I'm hoping someone in our guild would be willing to consider taking on one of the positions. All the meetings are held via Zoom and the people currently in the positions will be happy to help with the training for anyone who would be willing to do one of the jobs. Meetings are quarterly and are limited to one hour. I am involved as the Council Webmaster and Membership. It really doesn't take much to do any of the jobs, especially since the meetings are not in person any more but are all on Zoom.
