April 10, 2015

*Call to Order:* An Executive Board/Committee Chair Meeting of the F.Q.G. was held at the Quilters Cottage, in Fallbrook CA. The meeting was convened at 10:07 A.M. Presiding was President Sharon Baker. Members present were Ann Turley, Sue Colby, Diana Rash, Sandy Scott, Linda Flynn, Christy Smith, JoAnne Russell, Marie Sundsboe, Shirley Fleming and Sylvia Williams.

Items discussed:

*Previous Minutes:* March 05, 2015 General Membership meeting minutes were approved at the General Membership meeting on April 02, 2015. March 13, 2015 Executive Board meeting minutes were reviewed. Motion made by Sharon Baker to approve minutes, seconded by Sandy Scott. Motion passed. Minutes approved.

New Business (Sue Colby): Sue has obtained a quilt from Cindy DeWall, Mrs. Tickle Feathers in Escondido, who had completed long arm quilting for a FQG member who is now deceased. Cindy has had this quilt for a number of years. Sue will bring this quilt to the membership meeting in May to see if any member may recognize the quilt and identify the quilter. Perhaps this quilt could go to the auction at the quilt show.

Committee Reports:

Treasurer's Report (Marie Sundsboe): Last month's treasurer report contained some typographical errors (month vs. year-to date). Board discussed what should be in the report and published in the monthly newsletter. Decision was made to publish monthly expenses and monthly income with current bank balance.

Non-profit donation letter is available from the Treasurer when requested for a donation. It is no longer available online. The FQG does not keep records. It is the responsibility of the member to keep records for tax purposes.

Ways and Means (Sandy Scott): Sandy reported all guild members have received their minimum 30 raffle tickets. There were just a few packets that needed to be mailed out to members who had not been able to pick the tickets up at a meeting. Still have quite a number of members who have not yet paid for their raffle tickets. Three venues left to show the opportunity quilt.

FQG 2015 Quilt Show (Sandy Scott-Chair): No update needed. All committees humming along.

FQG 2015 Quilt Show (Linda Flynn-Boutique): Wonderful news! The Fallbrook Library has agreed to allow the FQG to use part of the Community Room at the library for the next few months to facilitate the boutique committee meetings. The "Sit, Stitch, and Share" sessions will be scheduled on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursdays of the month from 10-12 except for the months of June and July when the time will be 1-3. The sessions will be open to anyone in the community and may be great outreach for the guild. The room is huge and the partial room can hold 30-40 people. We can use the electricity and bring sewing machines. Light snacks OK. The FB Library will advertise and put up a sign display. The first session on May 14 can be used for creating boutique items or sharing pincushion and mug rug patterns. Thanks, Linda!

President-Elect (Shirley Fleming): Discussed the following ideas to generate increased membership and/or revenue for the guild:

- Develop a committee for military wives outreach, provide mentors for new quilters (pattern/fabric)
- Semiannual flea market during meetings when guild potlucks are scheduled (June/December), will need a flea market coordinator. Sylvia will email a pricing guide to Shirley.
- "Driving Miss Daisy" carpool program, article in newsletter to ask members if they are interested in carpooling to the general meeting whether it is to save gas or the environment or can't drive at night or at all, guild will facilitate matching members up by email

President's Announcements (Sharon Baker): The General meeting in June will be our Installation meeting and Potluck. If you have any fun ideas for the meeting, let Sharon know. We will have the opportunity raffle and the final UFO prize awards. The current Executive Board/Chairs agreed to take up a personal collection to thank Jan and Diane for the generous use of the Quilters Cottage for our monthly board meetings.

# **Exciting! New! Volunteer Opportunities for 2015-2016!**

With the start of the new 2015-2016 guild year, we will need enthusiastic volunteers to fill three new roles within the guild. These are intended to grow our membership, increase our revenues, and provide a courtesy service for existing and future members. The ideas for these new ventures were presented to our current Executive Board and received good reviews and support at the April Board meeting. They are as follows:

Outreach and Mentoring Program Chair and Committee: By reaching out to the spouses of military personnel based on Camp Pendleton, we will be tapping into a rich source of new membership. The Chair and committee would make contact with these folks, and encourage them to visit and join our guild. Our guild members will be asked to mentor new quilters, compile a beginner's kit consisting of a simple pattern, fabric, and tools/supplies (if possible), and basic instruction to get the newbies started on their quilting adventure. Patterns, fabrics, and some tools might already be available through donations to the upcoming Country Store.

We already have three new members who work on the military base, who might provide ideas for implementing this committee. This is another way for our quilting community to show our appreciation for the sacrifices these men and women make. Not only will we be "giving back", we will also be helping to spread the joy of quilting. When transferred to another military base, or when leaving the military, those we have mentored will be able to find new homes within new quilt guildcommunities. Please give serious consideration to this very worthwhile endeavor.

Flea Market Chair and Committee (Bi-annual Event): This is a great opportunity to increase our revenues. So, if you are a devout member of the "hunting and gathering" quilting clan, this is the opportunity for you! Twice a year, at our Christmas Potluck and our June Potluck, this committee would set up and present a Flea Market stocked with items leftover from the upcoming Country Store, items donated throughout the guild year to this committee, and (possibly) leftovers from the upcoming quilt show Boutique. The Chair and committee will need to have available storage for collection of goods, which could be distributed among committee members.

<u>"Driving Miss Daisy" Chauffeuring and Carpool Coordinator</u>: Some of our former and current members are not able to attend our guild meetings because they no longer drive, or do not like to drive at night. This committee coordinator would ask for volunteers to sign-up at each meeting to pick-up those needing transportation as well as return them to their homes after our meetings. Let's face it, ladies! We're all getting older, and will someday be grateful to have a courtesy service such as this offered to us. Just because some of our valuable members no longer drive, or have driving limitations, they should not be limited in their quilting friendships and opportunities.

I ask that you ALL give serious consideration to these valuable volunteer opportunities. Your 2015-2016 Board-Elect would like to have these chair, committee, and coordinator positions up and running by July 1, 2015. #### Here Kitty, Kitty, Kitty - BOM April 2015

From **background** fabric cut (most of the backgrounds in the packet are pink, grey or unbleached muslin):

- A) (1) 3.5" x 1.5"
- B) (3) 1.5" x 2.5"
- C) (1) 1.5" x 1.5"
- D) (3) 2.0" x 2.0"
  - (F) (1) 1.5" x 3.5"

Side borders: (2) 1.5" x 6.5"

Top/Bottom borders: (2) 1.5" x 8.5"

#### From "Cat" fabric cut:

- b) (6) 1.5" x 1.5"
- d) (3) 2.0" x 2.0"
- f) (1) 1.5" x 3.5"
- g) (2) 1.5" x 2.5"
- h) (1) 1.5" x 1.5"
- i) (1) 2.5" x 5.5"



Note: So the Kitty behaves and lies flat, press all seams open EXCEPT the flying geese and borders. Use a .25 " (1/4") seam allowance throughout.

- 1. Make three 'flying geese' pieces using a "b" piece sewn on the diagonal on either end of the "B" piece. Cut the extra corner fabric down to a ¼" seam allowance behind the cat fabric.
- 2. Place one D and one d right sides together. Draw a line from corner to corner. Sew ½" on either side of that line. Then cut the drawn line to give you two half square triangles. Do this with remaining D and d pieces. You will have 6 half square triangles (called the "Dd" piece) you will only use 5 of them! Trim the half square triangles to 1.5" squares aligning the 45 degree angle on your ruler along the seam line.
- 3. Layout the pieces to make the Cat block according to the picture. Sew by columns paying close attention to the direction of the half square triangles.
- 4. Column 1 is a Dd piece on either end of "f"
- 5. Column 2 is a Dd piece on one end of "F" and then a cat-colored "h" piece on the other end.
- 6. Column 3 is a Dd piece, then a Bb flying geese piece, then "g"
- 7. Sew column 1/2/3 together and sew the "A" piece across the top.
- 8. Column 4 is a Bb flying geese piece as the ears on the "i" piece.
- Column 5 is "C" and then a "Dd" piece then a "Bb" flying geese piece and the final "g"
- 10. Sew Column 4 and 5 together and then attach to the 1/2/3 piece from step 7.
- 11. Trim Cat to 6.5" x 6.5"
- 12. Add the side borders, and then the top/bottom border!
- 13. Block should be 8.5" x 8.5"
- 14. Have fun and make a few more!
