Barb handed the floor over to Sylvia Williams to introduce the evening's speaker, Shelley Swanland. Shelley proceeded to captivate our attention with her beautiful quilts and blocks made with stars. Everyone seemed to really enjoy seeing what Shelley has done with her patterns and color choices.

The business portion of the evening followed 10 minutes after Shelley finished. Barb stated that Renee Toomey had resigned her post as Secretary due to her knee injuries and surgery. Barb will continue doing the Guild meeting minutes until the new Board takes over. The next Board meeting will be held at the Cottage on Friday, 13 April from 10-12. Notices: The Fallbrook Garden Club is having a Horticulture Specialty Flow Show & Plant Sale from 10-4 on Saturday, 7 April at the Zion Lutheran Church. Bluebird Quilts is celebrating 10 years with a sale on 1 May from 10-6. Pick up one of the fliers on the back table. The Truckee Meadows Quilt Guild is presenting their 2018 Quilt Show on 17 & 18 August at the Reno-Sparks Convention Center from 10-4 each day. Bookmarks are on the back table.

Barb thanked all of the volunteers who stepped up to be a part of the 2018-2019 Guild roster and read all their names. The only opening left was the Block of the Month. At the close of the meeting, Barb was approached by Ann Turley who stated she would do the Block of the Month Yeah! When Barb told Sylvia as everyone left, she stated that Sheryl Kaplan also stated she would do it. SO, when you look at the nominations listing, you will see both names in that slot (might be 2 doing the job or only 1). Please study the nominations list and be prepared for presentation and voting in/accepting of officers for the 2018-2019 Board and Committees at the 3 May Guild meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Betsy Shirkey reported our income for March was \$420, expenses were \$846.43 leaving a balance of \$32,225.19.

Membership Report: Tina Rainey reported that we had 44 members and 2 guests (Fran & Marcy) in attendance tonight.

Speaker: As sated above, Sylvia Williams introduced Shelley Swanland early so we could all have the time to look at her patterns and goodies during break.

Show and Tell: Several members brought in their myriad of quilted items and photos were taken to be placed on the Guild's website..

Drawings: The drawings were held after Show and Tell. Roberta Ball won the Monthly drawing; Cup & A Quarter winners were Barb Anderson, Donna Carter & Barb Vajda – Donna took the fabric and Dixie Johns got the cup....so very sweet. Birthday drawing winners were Noni, Tina Rainey, Connie Folstadt, Donna Carter, Barbara Anderson, Jan McMillan, Barb Vajda, Betty Hall and another one or two that I didn't write down as I went up to pick up my prize – I apologize for not recognizing you).

Fallbrook Quilt Guild Board Meeting Minutes
13 April 2018

Meeting began at 10:15

President report – Barbara Vajda reported that all positions for the 2018-2019 Guild year have been filled. Block of the Month has 2 people listed (they might do the job together). She stated she would be attending the memorial for Carl Morrison on Saturday, 14 April and had a card for the Board to sign. Barbara locked in our dates for the next Guild year with the Community Center. Barbara reserved 12 July due to the 4th holiday and also tentatively reserved the 3rd & 10th of January due to the New Year. All dates were provided to Collette so she could confirm speaker dates. Collette could not attend the meeting and asked that the Board approve to meet on 10 January 2019 the 3rd due to New Year's. The Board agreed to meet on January 10th. **The first meeting of the 2018-2019 Guild year will be held on 12 July vice the 5th due to the 4th Holiday.** Sandy Scott informed Barbara at the Guild meeting that she would not be at the Board meeting, but would be submitting the next storage facility bill at the next Guild meeting which includes a 2nd fee increase starting the 1st of August. Discussion follows under "Other Business.

Treasurer's Report – Betsy Shirkey provided a spread sheet for attendees. Barbara suggested the 2018-19 budget be prepared in May/June to make it easier for the Treasurer to start the new Guild year with a budget in place vice waiting until August/September to have an approved budget. Betsy would like to try a 2-year Guild budget so we can show the membership the difference between Show and Non-Show year incomes/expenses.

Membership – Tina Rainey reported there were 44 members and 2 guests at March's meeting. Current membership total is 95. Tina (membership) will start sending our an email to remind new members of the upcoming Guild meeting each month as sometimes we get so busy we forget - or don't write it on our calendar. A friendly reminder only.

Vice President – Sylvia's final speaker, Becky McDaniel "My Applique Journey", is in May. Some of the members that attended April's workshop would like to have Shelley Swanland back again for another type of workshop. Sylvia will speak to Collette to see if her slate is full yet and if she can swing it.

Other Business – The Board discussed the "Turnover" meeting scheduled to be held in June. It was decided that those currently holding positions should get with the incoming position members to schedule the turnover of materials for their positions. As it worked this past year, we thought we'd try it again. So, those of you changing positions, look at the nominations listing and confer with your counterpart to schedule a turnover of materials. Those keeping the same positions, you have it easy....you get to keep your stuff for another year. Thanks for doing so.

The Board discussed the 2nd anticipated cost increase for the storage shed. Now it will be \$151/mo (\$1812/yr). An increase of \$112/yr. Historically, during a non-Show year, the Guild's income is much less than our Show years and has done its best to stay within our budget to ensure there is enough to sustain the Guild through to the next Show year. Although the bank balance stated at the Guild meeting shows we are pretty solvent, our expenses keep increasing and usually exceed our income. There was much discussion about it which also included the various types of items being stored in the shed (racks, poles, scrapbooks, amount of boxes/containers for Show Committees and Show stuff).

Tina Rainey made a motion that Sylvia Williams form a committee to do an inventory of what is in the storage shed while we are not in a Show year). Once completed, the inventory will be delivered to the Board to evaluate: (1) what the inventory consists of, (2) what is required for yearly storage, (3) what is required for Show storage and (4) what could be given to the Fallbrook Historical society. Betsy Shirkey seconded the motion. The Board approved.
