- Bring your scraps! Lots of scraps. Make sure that some are as long as 18". A series of fat quarters can work here too. It's always better to have more fabric to pick from, so err on the side of bringing more than less!

Piecing thread

**Cutting Mat** 

**Rotary Cutter** 

Ruler

## **BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

### October 10, 2014

Call to Order: An Executive Board/Committee Chair Meeting of the Fallbrook Quilt Guild was held at the Quilters Cottage in Fallbrook CA. The meeting was convened at 10:05 A.M. Presiding was President Sharon Baker. Members present were Sharon Baker, Ann Turley, Marie Sundsboe, Diana Rash, Ardis Duhachek, Jewell Burke, Jo Anne Russell, Sylvia Williams, Christy Smith, and Shirley Fleming.

Items discussed:

President (Sharon Baker): Read thank you card from Kayla Aleman, scholarship winner.

Secretary/Previous Minutes (Diana Rash): Minutes approved. Board discussed emailing minutes rather than publishing in newsletter due to space required to print. Decision to continue to print because it keeps more members informed.

Treasurer's Report (Linda Musillami): Treasurer not present. Sharon Baker/Marie Sundsboe reporting. Normal balance should be 20-30K with a current balance of 8K. Lower balance due to loss of opportunity to sell opportunity quilt tickets last year. Each committee chair needs to stay within their budget or they may not be reimbursed for additional expenses. Will consider decreasing scholarship to \$500 this year due to budget constraints. Some good news, Block of the Month's annual income was estimated at \$100 and they are already at \$79!

Question asked regarding what would be considered a tax deductible donation since the FQG is now non-profit. Sharon Baker will write an article for the newsletter with guidelines. A tax receipt is available from the Treasurer.

*Ist Vice President (Ann Turley):* January workshop will be at the Senior Center however Ann Turley has arranged to have future workshops at FPUD effective with the February workshop. Cost will be only \$25.00 which will allow us to have food/drinks in the room. This is a significant decrease in rent and will help with the budget. Programs needs a new quilt stand if it can fit into the budget.

November speaker, Sylvia Davis needs accommodations. Sharon Baker will take her to dinner. Shirley Fleming will check to see if her mother can provide housing. Ann will be unavailable for the November and December meetings. Diana Rash will announce the workshop information for the general membership meeting in November in Ann's absence. We may have another opportunity quilt from another guild at the November meeting.

Block of the Month (Susie Alderson): Looking for the display boards. Possibly in the cabinet where the library inventory is stored.

Ways and Means: Sharon Baker is taking the opportunity quilt to SCCQG on 10/11. Harvest Fair 10/18. Myrtle Creek 10/26

Hospitality (Shirley Fleming): Hospitality is in charge of entertainment for the December holiday party. Shirley suggested having Josh Fleming, an improvisational speaker, for the entertainment. He will speak on his experience growing up with quilters and the influence quilters have had on his life. Board agreed to pay a \$200 speaker fee. \$100 will come from the Hospitality budget and \$100 from the Programs budget.

Sharon Baker discussed bringing in canned food for the Fallbrook Food Pantry at the December meeting. This will be announced at the November meeting. Ardis Duhachek and Diana Rash will facilitate the collection. Sharon also suggested bringing in baby pictures (under 2 years) for a guessing game. We would need these to be brought to the November meeting to have ready for the December meeting. An announcement will be in the October newsletter. EDITOR NOTE-we will not be doing this next month.

Shirley Fleming stated that Cheryl Jeter has had great ideas and goes the extra mile!

Library (Ardis Duhachek): Need to have two tables set up instead of one. Sharon Baker to check with the Community Center regarding setup.

Newsletter (Christy Smith): Submissions due by October 17th.

President's Closing Comments (Sharon Baker): Be thinking of your replacements for next year's Board, have them shadow/mentor now, and keep your binders up to date! Also be thinking of boutique items for our next Quilt Show that would sell well.

Next Executive Board Meeting: Friday, November 14, 2014 at 10:00 A.M. at the Quilters Cottage, Fallbrook CA.

# BLOCK OF THE MONTH

## Measure up to Fall!

#### **UPDATED DIRECTIONS!**

This block is quite simple – but offers some good practice in precise cutting and sewing. The center of this block is a traditional "Nine-Patch". The 9-Patch is a standard in quilting and appears in many forms, in many blocks and therefore is a good technique to master. Follow the directions and measure along the way to ensure that you end up with a 'perfect' 8" x 8" block.

Material required: Two "fall themed" fabrics with high contrast – we'll call them print and solid here – but yours can be any two that you choose!

You need at least 37" of 2" wide Print fabric cut:

a. (1) 5" x 2" pieces c. (2) 3" x 2" piece e. (2) 5" x 2" pieces f. (2) 8" x 2" pieces

You need at least 13" of Solid fabric cut:

d. (1) 3" x 2" pieces b. (2) 5" x 2" piece

After you cut the pieces, measure them again. If you are precise at cutting it makes the sewing easier.

#### **Construction Steps:**

- 1. Sew pieces "b-a-b" (print in the center) together with ¼ inch seams. If you have done this properly you should have a 5" x 5" unit. Press seams towards piece "a". From this unit, cut (2) 2" wide strip (across all three fabrics so you have two 2" x 5" pieces).
- 2. Sew pieces "c-d-c" (print on each side) together with a ¼ inch seam. If you do this properly you will have a 5" x 3" unit. Press seams towards piece "c". From this unit cut (1) 2" wide strips (across all three fabrics so you have one 2" x 5" piece).
- 3. Sew a piece from step 1 on either side of the piece from step 2. This should make a checkerboard effect and is the "nine patch". Refer to the picture above and sew the three pieces together with 1/4 seams. If you have pressed properly the seams should "nest" together easily for pinning, so that when sewn they are perfectly aligned. Press the seams away from the center and measure the nine-patch. It should be exactly 5" x 5"!
