

Thom Atkins - October

Thursday Lecture: Trunk Show---my quilts start to finish

Thom has been fascinated with beads for over 30 years. He has done bead embroidery, jewelry, and added beads to some of his bronze sculptures. He bead embellishes quilts where the beads are embedded in the surface of the quilt and their application does the quilting. Using the quilt as a canvass and the beads as texture and paint, he has developed a unique style combining fabric and beads. He has published a book: **Beading Artistry for Quilters!**



Still a few seats left for the Workshop: Bead Embroidery for Quilters

The class takes a look at beads, their shapes, varieties of finishes, and their use on quilts to create texture and color changes in the surface. You will learn the basic stitches for applying beads, and what they do to the surface of the quilt, and how the application of beads quilts the surface. This is a process class. The student should have some prior knowledge of hand sewing and hand quilting. Bring embroidery scissors and pins. \$35 registration/\$25 kit fee payable to instructor

Lyn Mann - November

Lecture: Confessions of a "Skewed" Up Quilter.

This is a trunk show devoted to the concept of "skewing". She will explain its humble beginnings and expand on the technique and the various ways it can be used. Many different examples of it use will be shown. Lyn is a Well-known Southern California professional quilt designer, teacher and lecturer. She has been quilting since the early 80's and her interest went from hobby to passion and progressed to full time profession when she discovered she really enjoyed teaching. Over the years her quilts have been featured in numerous books and magazines.
