## ***October Meeting and Workshop.....Dixie Johns***

Debbie Gordon will be our guest, and her lecture is **Beyond the 1/4"** from the ordinary to the extraordinary. She will present ways to quilt your item more than **1/4"** beyond the edge of the design/figure. That sounds something that may especially helpful for those of us that usually do just that, or machine stipple all over.

Debbie was raised in California and learned to sew as a child by her great-grandmother and great aunt. She has taught needlework and quilting for community colleges, at quilt conferences, on cruises, at guilds, shops and private groups. She specializes in bringing new life to traditional patterns with creative arrangements and inventive color and fabric choices. ## ***January Quilts of Love Workshop***

At the September guild meeting, we were presented with the plan for our January charity quilt making workshop. At our October and December meetings, members will have the opportunity to bring fabric rectangles cut **2-1/2" to 3-1/2" wide and 7 1/2' long**. Perhaps you have scraps from projects on which you are presently working or fabric in your stash that you'd like to see turned into a quilt of love.

## QUILT COLLECTION INSTRUCTIONS—2019

Our quilt show is approaching and I want to give you a few instructions that you will need to know. There will be two days to drop off your quilts at my home on **MONDAY, November 4, from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm** and **TUESDAY, November 5 from 10:00 am to 12 pm**. If you need to drop off your quilts at a more convenient time please call me, 760-477-7068.

1. Make sure your sleeve is sewn on the top of your quilt
  - A) If your quilt is wider than 80 inches, divide the sleeve so there is an opening in the middle (for the shower curtain ring to hold up the pole)
  - B) With the back side of your quilt facing you, fold the quilt so that the bottom left hand corner is at the top. Important!
2. If your quilt is longer than 90 inches, please pin or baste UP to 90 inches.
3. Please wash, brush or put in your dryer so it is free of animal hairs.
4. You will receive a receipt for all your quilts entered. This receipt **MUST** be presented to collect your quilts on Saturday.
5. **ALL** quilts need to be tagged for placement in the show. If you need to deliver the quilt directly to the church, you **MUST** come to my home for the bag, tags, and receipts for your quilts.
6. My address is 1844 Fuerte St. Coming from Fallbrook take Reche Rd. to Green Canyon turn right onto Calmin Dr then at Fuerte St. turn left. Two story house with a white fence.

Please call me with any question you may have. I can't wait to see your quilts.
