EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Call to Order: An Executive Board/Committee Chair Meeting of the F.Q.G. was held at the Quilters Cottage, in Fallbrook CA on August 14th, 2015. The meeting was convened at 11:00 A.M. Presiding was President Shirley Fleming. Members present were Diana Rash, Sandy Scott, Christy Smith, Ardis Duhachek, Barbara Vajda, Dawn Johnson, Jan Conklin, Carol Carpenter, Anne Ottemann, and Sue Burns.

President's Announcements (Shirley Fleming): BOE tax filed. So Ca. Association of Quilt Guilds meeting attended on 07/11/2015 by Shirley and Lou Cobb. P.O. Box paid. Audit completed. SCCQG insurance fee for guild membership is due 10/3/2015. Fee is \$3.35 for each member. Next SCCQG meeting is 10/3/2015 with plans to show our opportunity quilt. Shirley and Lou have room for up to 3 additional members to attend).

Committee Reports:

Treasurer's Report (Barbara Vajda): Revised budget was distributed. Changes are noted in red. Discussion regarding previous year's income. Jan Conklin made suggestions to round off amounts for Block of the Month to \$225, Cup and a Quarter to \$850, Door Prizes to \$550, Monthly Drawing to \$800, Membership to \$3,000, and Opportunity Quilt to \$5,000. Discussed income projected for 2015 Quilt show. Entrance fee increased slightly this year and with better advertising and publicity, \$18,000 is projected for income. Discussed money making activities that could be undertaken during non-quilt show years such as quarterly flea markets or craft fairs. County has raised rental for community center. New contract signed. Rental fee has increased to \$240/night from \$190 for the community center auditorium. This \$50 increase has been waived for FQG though our June 2016 meeting. Starting in July 2016, FQG will pay \$240/meeting for the room rental.

Hospitality (Anne Ottemann, Sue Burns): Discussed new format with food/snacks set out by 6:00 p.m. Some members may not be able to get to the meeting by 5:45 p.m. for set up. Will put an article in the newsletter to explain new format. Members should try to get hospitality food to the meeting as close to 6:00 as possible however food arriving later can also be enjoyed at break. Sign-ups target should be 12 members with servings for 10-12 persons. Anne and Sue requested that Linda Palmer, Jane Larsen, and Molly Conley be included in Board agenda mailings as part of Hospitality committee. Thank you, Tuesday Girls for taking on this challenge!

Newsletter (Christy Smith): Due by August 19th. Slight increase in number of members requesting printed/postal copies of newsletters instead of email. This may possibly be due to newsletters lost in spam folders. Will announce at membership meeting to look in spam folders and remind members of cost of postage to mail and print newsletters unless members do not have access to a computer.

Directory (Sandy Scott): Directory has gone to the printer (Mark at Genco Printing). Fewer copies will be printed this year. Discussed putting the file on a PDF that could be offered as an option for members next year on the renewal form.

FQG 2015 Quilt Show (Sandy Scott-Chair): Sandy and Marie Sundsboe have been working on the credit card option for the show. Will set up a meeting to go over use of the credit card system. Ann Harris has developed a list of demonstrations including applique, wool applique, label ideas, rug hooking, mitered borders, red work embroidery, needle turn applique and bindings. Ursula Hohaus-Hawkins has volunteered for the needle turn applique demo. Betty Hall will chair the bed turning demonstration. Jane Larsen and Molly Conley are chairing the food booth and looking for food donations (water, coffee, soda). Ardis Duhachek is chairing donations. Albertsons corporate requires 6 weeks advance, Major Market is usually generous, will try Northgate and El Toro Market. Deadline for Program is October with layout finished in September. Diana Rash reported the current quilt entry count is 122. Carol Carpenter is chairing set up/take down. Will be taking signups to assist during the next two meetings. There will be reminders in the newsletter. Increase in budget for "ladder hired help" to enable hiring 4 men for most of the day starting at 7-8 a.m. until approximately 10 a.m. to set up pipes and drapes and hanging quilts from 9:30 until finished. Budgeted \$100 per helper for the day. Lighting is being rented from Abbey Rents. Will not allow "visitors" during set up as that slows down process. Plan on bringing a sack lunch.

Sign-ups: Diana Rash suggested that we establish a sign up table for sign up clipboards (examples: hospitality, quilt show, opportunity quilt) be placed on a table with a chair overseeing them. The sign-ups sometimes don't make it around the entire room or to the back tables. Members could sign up before the meeting or at break and everyone could have access and see which areas need more help.

Ways and Means (Jan Conklin): The quilt will be traveling to the Hemet Quilt Show on August 25th for the first time. May not attend smaller, less profitable events this year. Jan asked that her group be excused from Show and Tell volunteering since they are needed at the opportunity table.

Membership (Ardis Duhachek, Diana Rash): 101 members with 17 nonrenewals so far. If members who have not renewed come to the September meeting and do not renew, they will be charged the \$5 guest fee.

Next Executive Board Meeting: September 11, 2015 11:00 a.m.



The Countdown is On!

The September meeting is the <u>deadline</u> for entries for the quilt show. Please remember to attach a photo of the quilt, along with 2" swatches of the main fabrics in the quilt. This helps the Layout Committee when they determine which quilts to hang together. (Some printers don't print the colors truly.) <u>We don't need a photo of you; we have those from the Directory photos, unless you want a different photo for the quilt tag. Remember, also to bring 2 copies of the entry form!</u>

Quilt Show Countdown Process

Here's how the show will work from now on.

- 1. Entries come in at the September meeting. The Entry forms chair enters all the information into the Master Entries Template spreadsheet. She passes this file along to the Layout Committee about mid September.
- 2. The Layout Committee plans the arrangements of the quilts and determines sizes of poles and chains required to hang each quilt. This info is entered into the spreadsheet and the spreadsheet is passed along to the Programs and Quilt Tags Committee and the Quilt Collection committee, about the end of September.
- 3. The Quilt Collection committee prepares 2 sticky tags for each quilt (bag and quilt) and a receipt to provide to the guild member from the data in the spreadsheet.
- 4. The Programs committee uses information in the spreadsheet to produce the program for the show and the tags which will be hung on each quilt.
- 5. Fallbrook Mattress will deliver the bed and mattress on Wednesday, November 4
- 6. The Pipe and Drape setup from Abbey Party Rents will be delivered and set up starting at 8:00 AM on Thursday, November 5, including lighting, and pop-up canopies.
- 7. The Set-Up/Take-Down Committee will bring the poles and chains and get them sorted, ready for the quilts to be delivered.
- 8. The Quilt Collection committee collects the quilts from members, bags them and provides receipt to member. The committee brings the quilts to the show venue about 10:00 AM on Thursday, November 5.
- 9. Set-Up/Take-Down begins the process of hanging the quilts.
- 10. The Programs committee places the tags on the quilts after they are hung. After that, we can all go home! Until Friday morning! More on the Take-Down process in the next newsletter
