Quilt Show News

Many thanks to all our members, former members, husbands, sons, daughters, friends, and Rotarians who contributed to the tremendous success of our Quilt Show! Feedback was extremely positive and financial results were amazing. Through your hard work and openness to new ideas, we attracted 50% more paid attendees than our 2023 show. Auction attendance was up by 28%, largely due to the Door Prize baskets that you so generously donated.

Here are the preliminary income results, excluding taxes collected and fees:

Category	Gross Amt
Vendors (Doesn't include \$200 wooden bowl donation to the auction)	\$ 750
Admissions	\$ 6,100
Country Store	\$ 9,726
Auction & Door Prize Tickets	\$ 13,525
Total	\$ 30,101

We received positive feedback from our vendors, and attendees enjoyed having them in the showroom. Lesson learned... we apologize that some quilts were hidden by vendor displays. That won't happen again...

During the show, we presented quilts to 5 veterans. The 6th was unable to attend because he was hospitalized, but his quilt was delivered privately. Charlotte Seidman, our own Vietnam Veteran who served in the Army Nurse Corps as a senior for 2 years of active duty and 4 years in the reserves, assisted with the presentation.



Veterans honored:

Three of the Marine Corps vets came from Wounded Warriors, 2 who participate in the program, and a 3rd who volunteers in a leadership role. **Hunter Cork, James Lothrop, and Retired Captain William (Billy) Crytser** each received quilts.

Retired Captain Norm Lord, who served for 28 years in the Navy and 14 years as a volunteer Fallbrook Sheriff's Deputy, also received a quilt.

Retired Sergeant Major Jacquelyn Gibson was referred to us by the Fallbrook VFW. She served for 23 years in the Marine Corps and was honored as the Grand Marshall of the Veteran's Parade.

Retired Chief Petty Officer Jeff Forbes who was also honored, served 23 ½ years in the Army and Navy, and continues to provide transportation to disabled vets for their medical appointments.

Prior to the presentation, several quilts were transferred from the auction to our veteran program. We made a conscious decision to reduce income because it is more important for our non-profit organization to serve our community!

February, 2026 Free Motion Quilting Workshop

Have you ever wondered how to take your own quilts beyond stitching in the ditch or meandering? At our February meeting, Kathy Proctor will reveal many of the tips and techniques that she has learned over the years. She will share her thought process as she prepares to quilt, along with a few tricks. Remember, done is better than in a closet. Although Kathy does freehand quilting on her stand-up longarm (without a computer), the methods that she teaches can be used on your domestic sewing machine.

On Saturday, February 7, Kathy and Cindy Stephen will conduct a free workshop for guild members at FPUD where you can learn techniques such as free motion feathers, wishbones, woodgrain, and more. In addition, grid quilting techniques such as orange peel and apple core will be covered. Bring your machine and a sense of adventure and we will assist you as you add a new skill or two to your machine quilting toolbox.
